FEEDING PROJECT

From our very inception the Al Fidaa Foundation operated and assisted many community feeding soup kitchens in Eastern Cape of South Africa. At times our numbers peaked over a 100 000 soup based meals per month. Undoubtedly, working on the ground and seeing impoverished faces we continue in our mission that poverty is a much complicated issue. Feeding from a soup kitchen is the easiest solution for a community of kids and children who spend their days in hun-



ger, learners at school who need food to concentrate or the elderly who require food for the effectiveness of their medicine. Our offices continue to receive warm and loving feedback on the difference we are making to countless individuals.

THE 9 TO 5 SOUP KITCHEN STRATEGY

To deliver effectively to the needy and in a controlled environment, the Al Fidaa Foundation has embarked on the 9 to 5 Soup Kitchens. The poor would be able to access food any day of the week between 9 to 5. They would be assured of fresh, hygienic food, prepared with love by our volunteers. All will be welcome, be it the student requiring nourishment to concentrate for their lessons; an exhausted breadwinner who returned home

empty handed or the elderly requiring food to be taken with medicine- The AI Fidaa Foundation 9 to 5 SOUP KITCHEN will be ready to serve and show love to humanity.

- "We have two dedicated courts dealing with sexual offences"
- "We requesting lunch packages for our child victims that are coming to court to testify."
- "Most of them come with empty stomachs which affect their ability to think straight and respond to questions."


