

We have to buy the cheapest of the cheapest. We are rated as the cheapest of the cheapest.' - Elzetta, youth headed household, Bloemendal

'Whenever the budget is announced, our lives take a turn for the worse, because the prices of basic goods just go up.' - Community member, Eastern Cape

For child-headed households in Bloemendal, Eastern Cape, the daily diet consists of white bread and a carton of cheap juice or sugar water (known locally as the 'poppie water diet').

'Due to the poor quality of food the children wake up hungry in the middle of the night and this bothers us. At times we feel it would be better if someone adopted them so as to give them a chance in life.'

'Beans and samp are our normal food but we cannot cook this because it uses too much electricity. The wood that was freely available in our area is no longer there, we have to buy it.' - Child-headed household PARTICIPANT IN FGD, KwaNobuhle, Eastern Cape

In Peddie in the Eastern Cape, children are eating wild plants to survive, as the Covid-19 pandemic and the lockdown take their toll. The number of households going hungry has doubled, according to new research.


One woman had told him, "My children will tell you the taste of every plant in this area, as for the last three months I have been feeding them these plants."

Researchers in the National Income Dynamics Study (NIDS) – Coronavirus Rapid Mobile Survey (NIDS-CRAM) released on Wednesday, found that 47% of respondents reported that their household ran out of money to buy food in April 2020. Before the lockdown, 21% of households reported that they ran out of money to buy food in the previous year.

"Pandemic-induced job losses present a major threat to the livelihoods of a large proportion of grant receiving households precisely because earnings has been an important source of income for most grant-receiving households." However, about 30% of those who had lost their jobs between February and April reported no household grant income at all.

and submitting my forms, my business HOUSE OF TSHIWO was awarded with R85,830 of funds which enabled me to purchase two Gemsy industrial machines, an industrial over locker, clothing rack, office equipment, a financial management course and a monthly allowance of fabric and threads.

My business has now been running for 4 months at a profit. The Al-Fidaa foundation has armed me with the skills and opportunity to change my situation and inspire my peers, I have not only been given the tools to materialise my dreams but I'll also be helping 2 families put food on the table and play a part in growing and sustaining the economy." 1 Musallâ Abu Ubaidah -

Missionvale Being ideally situated on the main road in the old township of Missionvale, the weekly Jumu'ah salâh is also held here. A variety of Ulamâ conduct the Jumu'ah program at this venue. This facility also serves as a venue for adult ladies classes for the many reverts in the area.



2 Musallâ Uthmaan ⁻ Bethelsdorp Ext 28

Nestled amongst the houses of the locality this facility is situated in a cul-de-sac surrounded by many Muslim homes. This facility is always abuzz with many weekly programs, visiting Tabligh jamâ'ats and ladies programs.



3 Masjid Uthmaan ibn Affaan -Zimdahl St Gelvandale

Recently established, this masjid serves the many Muslims residing in the upper parts of the huge suburb of Gelvandale. In an area where people have been exposed to constant gun battles between rival gangs, the establishment of this masjid has seen a rapid decline in this warfare. Weekly Jumu'ah & Eid Salâh is conducted at this venue.

4 Musallâ Hamzah - C/o Azalea & Bottlebrush St Gelvandale

This facility has been established in an area which has never had a venue of its kind. Muslims from this locality were forced to travel distances to the nearest venue for salâh and Jumu'ah. With its establishment, congregational salâh and madrasah has now been brought to their doorstep.

5 Masjid Noor - Bloemendal

Al Fidaa Foundation has recently been given the responsibility of operations at this facility. This venue consists of a masjid, madrasah complex and Imâm's residence. Daily salâh and Jumu'ah are conducted here. Much needed repairs are needed at this venue as elaborated upon in our publication.

1 Renecke Street Helenvale

Alhamdulillâh, the construction of this facility is at an advanced stage already. Much will still be needed to take it to completion. In-shâ-Allâh, this venue will provide facilities for salâh, madrasah and beneficial programs for the Muslim community. Muslims

from this area will provided with a beautiful structure to support them in fulfilling their Deeni responsibilities.



2 Schauderville

This area consists of main senior members of the Muslim community of Port Elizabeth. They have been deprived over the years from having a close-by, decent facility for salâh and Islâmic education. Alhamdulillâh, through the generosity of some individuals a premises has been

purchased and is soon going to be converted into this much need facility.

Our White Door Centre is run in partnership with the Eastern Cape Department of Social Development

CASES SEEN

01 Received a referral from a service provider about a minor who was physically abused by a family member. The White Door social worker accordingly reported and followed up the case with the Department of Social Development

Divorced female allegedly abused by her former husband. Close family members were unaware of the ongoing abuse even though it was over a long period of time. She did not feel able to disclose the abuse to her family. Client is currently unemployed and battling financially. The only current income is the child maintenance sum received from the abusive ex husband.

Parent sought assistance on behalf of their child who was allegedly physically abused by her life partner. Client was referred to the South African Police Service and ongoing counselling was offered to the client.

Differently abled client reported being abused verbally and financially by her child. Client was referred to the Department of Social Development.

Confused and frustrated female sought assistance as she was forced to flee her home following death threats. The client disclosed that she particularly frustrated as she has a physically challenged relative who was also residing with her and is battling to secure accommodation for the relative. The client was offered counselling and referred to the South African Police Service.



Female was allegedly abused by her life partner and his mother for several years; she managed to escape but he contacted social services and her children were removed and placed in his care. He claims she was an alcoholic. Client felt let down by resources but was encouraged through parenting skills, counselling and support to rebuild her life and get her children back from her alleged abuser. She has turned her life around and living independently and has access to her children.

TO AT THE

Mother has been battling with son who has been abusing substances since he found out he was conceived through rape. According to her he is violent when demanding money from her, regularly engages in criminal activity, stealing from the community as well as family members. Client now fears for her son's life after a relative threatened to stab him to death because he stole from him. She is receiving treatment for depression because her son's behavior has caused marital issues between her and her husband, who is threatening to walk out on her due to the aforementioned issues.

Victim of verbal abuse diagnosed and treated for depression. According to the client, her husband took advantage of her mental state and filed for a divorce, devastating her and leaving her stranded emotionally and financially.

Adult male client reported for counselling. He was badly traumatized after helplessly watching his home burn down with his child and his life partner inside. He blames himself for not being able to do more to save them and admits to contemplating suicide as this is hard to live with.

Muslim Orphanage

Catering for the needs of the orphaned Muslim, the first in the Eastern Cape

The vast area of the Eastern Cape does not have a single house to cater for Muslim children! Muslim children are often placed in a state owned facility or registered safe houses.

The need for an orphanage that caters solely for Muslim children cannot be overemphasized. The are no state owned facilities or registered safe houses that cater Halaal food so any Muslim orphan would be forced to eat Haraam.

As most orphanages are predominantly Christian, Muslim children are included in their prayer session where there are no Salaah facilities, Quraans or Islamic literature available.

Orphans in a state run facility have

limited or more often no access to other Muslim community members

Sahl ibn Sa'd 🚵 reported: The Prophet, peace and blessings be upon him, said,

Now with the grace of Allah, the open hearts and generosity of donors and your duas the Al-Fidaa Foundation has setup the first Muslim orphanage in Port Elizabeth caring for the orphaned Muslim children and a comfortable homely environtment.

ORPHANED, ABANDONED & NEGLECT CASES THAT WE DEALT WITH

CASE #1: Abandoned male teen was provided with temporary care and family reunification services.

CASE #2: A 15 and 10 year old boy was provided temporary care while their mother received medical attention for 2 months, otherwise they would have been

placed in a state facility by the department social worker. **CASE #4:** Application for care of a 15 and 7 year old girl who are living in a 1

CASE #3: SA 14 and 10 year old boy is currently being cared for as their parents passed away with no extended family being able to care for them. **CASE #4:** Application for care of a 15 and 7 year old girl who are living in a Non Muslim CYCC are being made through the social worker and childrens court.

There are many more cases that we've dealt with and continue to deal with on a regular basis.

CLINIC: Access to medical services and basic health care screening proves challenging to many of our beneficiaries who cannot afford the cost of private services or are not physically able to stand in long queues at our state run clinics and hospitals. Many of our beneficiaries are pensioners or people who are affected by high-blood pressure, diabetes, or other chronic illnesses. Several incidences were observed of


