Al Fidaa Ta'leemi Department

Al Fidaa Foundation has taken this responsibility of fortifying the Îmân of our generation and the next through the Maktab teaching system. This system has stood the test of time and has emerged as the best way to safeguard our children from fitnah (mischief) and fasåd (corruption). Education is imperative to understanding, appreciating and practising our Deen. May Almighty Allâh grant high stages in Jannah (paradise) to our pious predecessors who were inspired to initiate this golden way of imparting knowledge of Dîn to the next generation, امئن.

We have been operating in underprivileged and poverty-stricken areas of Port Elizabeth since 2009. We are currently operating 13 makâtib with a total of 313 students (as at March 2016) and 19 Ustaads. Our makâtib are mostly informal structures with minimum requirements. The Îmân of community members are under duress due to prevalent social evils, gangsterism and drugs. Some students come from homes where parents are not Muslims, thus students and Ustaads should be complimented for the extra effort they make.

» Inspections and management

Regular inspections are done at all the makâtib to evaluate the students and Ustaads. Workshops are also conducted to enhance the teaching abilities of Ustaads. All inspections are emailed to us. The data is captured on our computer system so that we monitor Maktabs and attend to any queries promptly.

» Student Meals and Food Parcels

Meals are fed to counter the pangs of hunger and enhance their concentration in the classroom before they start classes. These meals are

cooked and prepared by 12 ladies in close proximity to the Maktabs. Many students look forward to this meal as sometimes it is their only meal for the day. On a regular basis we also supply families of students with food parcels containing basic supplies for their daily needs as they come from poverty stricken communities.

» Continuous interaction with parents

We have a system in place where attendance and behaviour issues are dealt with immediately thus keeping parents abreast with the happenings in the classroom. In severe cases a delegation from the Ta'leemi department will meet personally with parents. A regular program is also held where parents are invited to a meal and important issues discussed. These gatherings foster a good relationship and understanding amongst parents, students and ustaads.

PORT ELIZABETH

Almost 10 years ago, 12 women from a friendship club, decided to organise a winter blanket and Ramadaan food hamper charity campaign. These charity initiatives were carried out informally by volunteers and without the supervision of a chairperson or formal committee.

In October 2014, our Gardens for Gaza initiative was a resounding success, the proceeds were given to the Al-Imdaad foundation towards their water pipeline project, so sorely needed in Gaza.

In 2015, we focused on bringing aid to the local community and joined forces with the Al-Fidaa foundation. We began with the blanket drive in winter and in Ramadhaan helped with hampers that were distributed to the poor and needy Muslims. We embraced an initiative that

originated in Johannesburg, where gift boxes were given to Muslim children in the maktabs. We also gifted the children Jusdaans and stationery for Eid ul Adhaa.

The major project for the year 'Through the Country Gates' was a tremendous success and most of the proceeds were handed over to the Al Fidaa foundation to be used for their feeding scheme, and elsewhere where they felt it was most needed.

From the Zakaah and Lillah Desk

Assalâmu alaikum

Alhamdulillâh, Almighty Allâh, through the channel of charity, brings relief to the underprivileged and poverty-stricken members of our community. Due to deteriorating economic conditions, many people find themselves unable to make ends meet. Accommodation becomes unaffordable, living expenses become unbearable and where the next meal will come from becomes unimaginable.

Our office has seen an increase of individuals registering on our database. We have reached a total of 1400 Zakaah applicants that are experiencing difficulty in seeing to their needs and the needs of their families. With these numbers continuously increasing we are finding it very difficult to assist each and every person. Our food parcel program for the elderly, frail, widows and the unemployed supplements their daily nutritional needs and is greatly valued.

Alhamdulillâh, through the grace of Almighty Allâh, we were able to also assist people with their rentals, stationery and schools shoes. The elderly and disabled applicants were assisted

with wheelchairs and miscellaneous medical supplies.

There is a great need for us to channel our zakaah funds towards those in close proximity. Being exposed to the plight of the poor in our surroundings we are faced with the reality of belief turning to disbelief. A food parcel or a few rands might become a means of a person's Imân being safeguarded.

Indeed, we are able to bring some relief to our needy recipients and tears of joy overpower us that we can be in a position to help them with the funding of our community. For us to be able to assist as many people as possible, we require sufficient funding. We thus urge one and all to utilize these avenues of charity which not only cools the anger of the Almighty but also acts as a means of safety against calamities befalling us.

1. Chronically ill struggle to cope with medical bills

A single lady living on her own, after having worked for many years, now struggles to cope with medical bills. She has been diagnosed with many chronic illnesses requiring many expensive procedures and medication. After having paid a visit to the applicant, we were taken aback by her physical condition and through the grace of the Almighty we were able to assist with some of her medical bills.

2. Underprivileged youngster unable to pay for tuition fees

A young man living in one of the underprivileged areas has managed to commence studies in the field of psychology at a local tertiary institute. Due to the high cost of studies he is left with an outstanding amount which he is unable to pay. He approaches our offices wanting to work in order to supplement income towards payment of fees. Alhamdulillah, we were able to remove this debt upon his shoulders, giving him the opportunity to further pursue his ambition.

3. A few pieces of wood chopped together serving as a shelter...

With only a few pieces of wood chopped together and a small window serving as their home, a husband and wife brave the harsh weather conditions and unsafe environment. Looking at their plight, we managed to convert a container into a temporary shelter serving as a safer and warmer environment. They were also assisted with obtaining identity documents which are necessary in these times especially when seeking employment. Alhamdulillah, they have since found suitable accommodation and the container relocated for future use.

4. Sight, a bounty from the Almighty.

The exorbitant cost of spectacles and sight improving procedures have left many people incapable of living normal lives. Through the generosity of a local optometrist, many applicants were assisted with spectacles. Some were also referred for cataract removal operations. Alhamdulillah, we are happy to have been associated with this venture in bringing relief to those that have been tested in this regard.

5. The elderly, the frail and the disabled

Indeed having a family member who is frail or disabled places a great strain upon family members. The costs involved in seeing to the needs of those in these conditions are extremely high. Families are thus burdened with high costs of equipment, consumables, medication, etc.

Alhamdulillah, through generous donations we are able to provide wheelchairs, commodes and nappies to all those who find themselves in these situations. The relief gained through this assistance is evident from the various people we have interacted with. Indeed their sacrifices will be highly rewarded by the Almighty and those aiding their plight will share in this reward.

6. Accommodation, one of the biggest needs of the time

We have seen people unable to afford accommodation for their families. High rental costs, unemployment and other social conditions have made it difficult for people to survive. Alhamdulillâh, we were able to assist widows, single mothers, the unemployed and poverty-stricken to secure a roof over their heads. People would come with eves welling up with tears, not knowing where they'll sleep the night as they are put on the streets by landlords / ladies. Unemployed fathers would not know where to turn to, with home not being an option because how would he tell his family that they have to pack up their goods, despite having nowhere to go.

Assistance would be provided for one month giving the applicant a chance to either find suitable employment or cheaper accommodation.



- · Married couple, both HIV positive and unemployed struggling to meet their day to day expenses. Their adult daughter is unaware of their status.
- · 35 year old female repeatedly raped and beaten by her husband in full view

- of their children. She eventually sought help by placing a restraining order against him.
- · 33 year old single mother dealing with the rape of her 6 year old daughter on school grounds by a fellow pupil.
- 37 year old mother of 3 fled her home with the children and moved to another province to escape the abuse of her husband.
- 31 year old female beaten up by her partner and living in fear. She was admitted to hospital for stitches due to physical abuse.







Volunteers include dedicated trained counsellors and psychologists.


